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Singular and Plural

In English language “S” or “es” is added after the noun to make it plural. For example Books for the Book and classes for the class. In Arabic language the most common and easy method to make plural is to add ون or ين at the end of a noun. For example مُسْلِمُونَ or مُسْلِمِينَ is the plural for مُسْلِم (a Muslim).

Singular	Plural
مُسْلِم	مُسْلِمُونَ، مُسْلِمِينَ
مُؤْمِن	مُؤْمِنُونَ، مُؤْمِنِينَ
صَالِح	صَالِحُونَ، صَالِحِينَ

You have already studied نَحْنُ، هُوَ، هُمْ، أَنْتَ، أَنَا، أَنْتُمْ. Now we will practice these words joining with مُؤْمِنُونَ، مُؤْمِنِينَ using the TPI method. You just remember that مُؤْمِن will come with أَنَا، هُوَ، أَنْتَ because of singular form and مُؤْمِنُونَ will come with هُمْ، أَنْتُمْ and نَحْنُ because of plural format.

Arabic words	Translation
هُوَ مُؤْمِن	He is a believer.
هُمْ مُؤْمِنُونَ	They are believers
أَنْتَ مُؤْمِن	You are a believer.
أَنَا مُؤْمِن	I am a believer.
أَنْتُمْ مُؤْمِنُونَ	You (all) are believers
نَحْنُ مُؤْمِنُونَ	We (all) are believers

Question	Answer
مَنْ هُوَ؟	هُوَ مُؤْمِن
مَنْ هُمْ؟	هُمْ مُؤْمِنُونَ
مَنْ أَنْتَ؟	أَنَا مُؤْمِن
مَنْ أَنْتُمْ؟	نَحْنُ مُؤْمِنُونَ
