Feminine Gender  
(Singular)

Let us learn Arabic words for “She” and “Her”.

هي she. When you say هي (she) or ها (her) show towards your left using the pointing of your left hand; as if that lady is on your left side.

To make the feminine gender of most of the nouns, just add ة at the end. For example:

Singular Masculine	Singular Feminine
مُؤْمِنٌ	مُؤْمِنَةٌ
مُسْلِمٌ	مُسْلِمَةٌ
صَالِحٌ	صَالِحَةٌ

Take a deep breath and practice with TPI

Masculine	Feminine
هُوَ مُؤْمِنٌ	هِيَ مُؤْمِنَةٌ
هُوَ مُسْلِمٌ	هِيَ مُسْلِمَةٌ
هُوَ صَالِحٌ	هِيَ صَالِحَةٌ

ها: her. (This word comes always in the last).

Memory tip: After any Sahabi’s (companion of the Prophet ﷺ) names, we generally use رَضِيَ اللهُ عَنْهُ (may Allah be pleased with him). Similarly, for a woman of that group, we use رَضِيَ اللهُ عَنْهَا. For example, عَائِشَةُ رَضِيَ اللهُ عَنْهَا, أَبِيبَكْرٌ رَضِيَ اللهُ عَنْهُ.
