she. when you say هي (she) or هٰ (her) show towards your left using the pointing of your left hand; as if that lady is on your left side.

To make the feminine gender of most of the nouns, just add 3 at the end. For example:

Memory tip: After any Sahabi's (companion of the Prophet مِنْ عَنْهُ) names, we generally use رَضِيَ اللهُ عَنْهُ (may Allah be pleased with him). Similarly, for a woman of that group, we use رَضِيَ اللهُ عَنْهَا .
