
Qur'an Lesson-16b: Don't ask unnecessary questions!

(Al-Baqarah: 108)

Lesson Outcomes

- Allah mentions the questioning habit of Jews to Musa AS.
- This habit leads to the exchange of disbelief with faith.
- Such a person will be astray from the straight path.

Recitation and Explanation



- Jews at the time of Musa AS used to ask irrelevant questions, disobeying him, and demanding unreasonable things. For example, they asked him to show Allah openly. As a result of such an outrageous demand, they were struck by a thunderbolt, and all of them died. Later, Musa AS pleaded Allah, and they were brought back to life.
- A person asked Prophet to send down the book from the sky or bring rivers as proof of prophethood. Allah warned Muslims not to ask such questions. For sincere people there are enough number of Allah's signs around.
- (سُوْلَكُمْ is addressed to Jews too. O Jews! Your messenger is Muhammad رَسُوْلَكُمْ is addressed to Jews too. O Jews! Your messenger is Muhammad
- We should not question the guidelines or commands given in authentic Hadith / Sunnah. If we don't understand anything from Qur'an or Hadith, then we should ask a scholar.

Hadith: Abu Huraira RA reported that he heard Allah's Messenger as saying: Avoid that which I forbid you to do and do that which I command you to do to the best of your capacity. Verily the people before you went to their doom because they had put too many questions to their Prophets and then disagreed with their teachings. (Muslim 1337b)

Imagine & Feel: Imagine a student who even after getting clear guidelines-keeps asking irrelevant questions from the teacher and does not focus on his homework? Will his teacher be happy with him? Like this, we are given clear guidance to follow it, so instead of asking an unreasonable question, we should follow the guidance.

Think & Ponder:

- You can ask questions to learn but not those that are rebellious in nature or stubbornness.
- Allah helps the serious and sincere learner.

Du'a: O Allah! Help us value the blessings of Islam and the Messenger

Evaluate: Am I a sincere learner of Islam?

Plan: Insha'Allah! I will ask scholars whenever I have doubts or questions about Islam.
