Its Simple to make things Complex, but Complex to make things simple

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
# A DIFFERENT CALCULATION - RESPONSIBILITY






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




# ACTIVITY: REVISION/ WARM-UP

### PRIOR KNOWLEDGE ACTIVATION

Less effort from the teacher




#### DURING THE CLASS: DELIVERING YOUR LESSON PLAN
