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3. Lesson Planning

If you fail to plan, you plan to fail.

Introduction

A lesson plan is a teacher's detailed description of a lesson's course of instruction or "learning trajectory." A teacher develops a daily lesson plan to guide class learning. Without a lesson plan, a teacher's achievement would be incomplete and shows a highly unprofessional approach. It is best practice to prepare lesson plans and revise them frequently. If you fail to plan, you plan to fail.

An effective lesson plan should be prepared before the class and reviewed after the class for improvements. It is prepared to consider the different types of learners, including activities suitable for visual, auditory, and kinesthetic learning patterns. Lesson plans should also include the concept of learning centers and allow flexibility and ownership of learning for the students. Student engagement is achieved by a proper lesson plan, and desired outcomes of the course are completed. A teacher should be able to prepare annual, monthly, weekly, and daily lesson plans.
