

### 12<sup>th</sup> year (Makki period) First Pledge

- In the 11th Nabawi year, during the Hajj, six men of Madinah from Khazraj tribe had accepted Islam. They had promised to the Prophet that they would return to their people and spread the message of Islam.
- So, in the 12th Nabawi year, during another Hajj season, 12 persons from Madinah met the Prophet .
- This meeting took place near a valley in Mina, where they pledged their loyalty to the Prophet on various matters. This significant event is known as the "First Pledge of 'Aqabah."





#### 12th year (Makki period)

## Lessons & Action plan (First Pledge)

- The elders & leaders of the community should take the lead in serving the religion. Their active participation will set a positive example for others, especially the younger generation, and will inspire them to develop a strong inclination towards good deeds.
- Nurture the faith. Enhance your character & morals, as this will also motivate others to gain a better understanding of Islam and its principles.





### 12<sup>th</sup> year (Makki period)

#### Mus'ab (RA) in Madinah

- Following the Hajj, the Prophet entrusted Mus'ab bin Umair (RA) with the task of teaching Islam to the people of Madinah who had embraced Islam.
- Mus'ab (RA) resided at the house of Asad bin Zurarah (RA) in Madinah, and together, they began spreading the teachings of Islam.
- As a direct result of the efforts and preaching of these two, a significant number of people in Madinah embraced Islam in a very short period.





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## 12<sup>th</sup> year (Makki period) Lessons & Action plan (Mus'ab RA in Madinah)

- Develop important skills and utilize them for Islam.
- Share the message of Islam wholeheartedly.
- Teach the principles of Islam and the teachings of the Qur'an to your community and encourage them to stay away from all types of shirk.






#### 13th year (Makki period)

## Second Pledge of Allegiance, from 72

- In the 13<sup>th</sup> Nabawi year, 72 Muslims from Madinah came to Makkah for Hajj.
- During this time, the Prophet took pledges of allegiance from them on several important matters, such as:
  - Either agility or laziness, you will listen and obey in all situations
  - Poverty or prosperity, you will spend in all circumstances
  - you will enjoin what is good, and forbid what is wrong
  - When I come to you, you should support & protect me just as you protect your own life and children.
  - O In return, there will be Jannah for you!



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### 13<sup>th</sup> year (Makki period) Lessons & Action plan

(Second Pledge of Allegiance, from 72)

- Check yourself in the context of every aspect of the pledge of allegiance.
- Remember the spirit & purpose of Hijrah.
- The Prophet said: "A Muhajir (emigrant) is the one who gives up all what Allah has forbidden. (Bukhari: 10)





# 13<sup>th</sup> year (Makki period) Permission of Hijrah (for Sahabah) (1)

- It became tough for Muslims to stay in Makkah due to the persecution from the disbelievers of Makkah.
- As Islam started spreading in Madinah after the 2<sup>nd</sup> pledge of allegiance, the Prophet permitted Muslims to migrate to Madinah, and believers began to move there gradually.





# 13<sup>th</sup> year (Makki period) Permission of Hijrah (for Sahabah) (2)

- Sahabah made significant sacrifices for Hijrah.
- Some had to leave behind their homes, wealth, and possessions, while others had to give up their trades, businesses, and even their families, like parents, siblings, wives, and children.
- But they were content and happy because they knew that in Madinah, they could worship the one God freely.





#### 13<sup>th</sup> year (Makki period) Lessons & Action plan

(Permission of Hijrah for Sahabah – 3)

- The righteous servants of Allah do not hesitate to migrate when it comes to safeguarding their faith.
- In every era, not only was there opposition to the true religion, but those who followed the true faith also had to face various difficulties.
   However, in the end, the truth prevailed and remained victorious.
